living with hearing loss - hearing loss association of ... - hearing loss statistics there are 48 million americans with measurable hearing loss. only 1 out of 5 people who could benefit from wearing hearing aids actually wears them. hearing loss affects all age groups 65% of people with hearing loss are under age 65. 15% of school age children have a measurable hearing loss.
